The NEIL AND ELISE WALLACE STRATUS Center for Medical Simulation *Virtual Course in Simulation Education* trains clinicians from around the world to be effective simulation educators. This 12-week, intensive virtual program allows participants to gain an understanding of key components of simulation and medical education.

The curriculum is designed for individuals who intend to use simulation in their medical education roles. Through a combination of independent reading, focused lectures, and small group workshops, the participant will gain a detailed understanding of the simulation modalities used in the education of learners.

During this course, there will be a focus on design and implementation of simulation curriculum as well as learner assessment. This program is designed to prepare healthcare providers to be effective simulation educators without the need to travel while interacting with a world class curriculum.
